Spiritual Wing Activities

1. Chennai West

• Rathothsavam Inauguration at Chennai West District:

The Rathothsavam for Chennai West was ceremoniously inaugurated on 21st June at the Kodambakkam Samithi. The event commenced at 10:30 a.m., with the arrival of Swami being reverently welcomed through Poornakumbham offerings and Vedam chanting, setting a sacred ambience.

The program featured devotional songs and bhajans rendered by Samithi members, uplifting the spiritual atmosphere. Esteemed guest Kavignar Ponmani addressed the gathering, delivering a message on the significance of maintaining purity of mind and the deeper spiritual essence of the Rathothsavam tradition.

• Rathothsavam Celebrations - Nungambakkam Samithi:

On 21st June, Bhagawan arrived at Nungambakkam Samithi at 4:30 p.m., received with heartfelt devotion by Balvikas children, who performed Kolattam and rendered devotional music to welcome Him.

At 6:30 p.m., Swami set out on a procession, covering Noor Veerasami Lane, Thirumurthy Nagar, and adjoining areas, sanctifying each step with divine presence and deep spiritual resonance.

 of primary tests including Sugar test, BP test, and weight checkup were done. Treatment was
 provided to a total of 108 individuals, including Auto drivers and their family members. 30
 sevadals did seva in this camp.
