Spiritual Wing Activities

1. Sundaram 45th Anniversary celebrations

The 45th Anniversary was celebrated on 3 days (17th, 18th and 19th of Jan) at Sundaram in a grand manner. Lakshmi Hayagreeva and Sri Saraswathi Homams were conducted for Saturday for students. Around 750 students from various schools and 750 devotees participated. On 18th Jan., Maha Rudram was conducted. Around 800 devotees participated and received the blessings of Bhagawan. On 19th Sundaram anniversary was celebrated with Gayathri homam and Sashsrnama Archana. Nama Sankeerthanam by Karthik Gnaneshwar and team was held in the evening.

• “Ashanthi to Prashanthi” Exhibition

The “Ashanthi to Prashanthi” exhibition was conducted on 4th January 2026 at Bharathidasan Colony Samithi, in conjunction with the Centenary Celebrations at Bhuvanewari Amman Temple, K.K. Nagar. Inaugurated by Sri. Narayan Sethuraman, the program was attended by our State President, Sri. S. R. Chandrasekharan, along with state functionaries and district office bearers from both Northwest and South districts, reflecting the importance of the event at the organizational level.

The exhibition presented a structured spiritual narrative, illustrating the transformation from inner turmoil to supreme peace as taught in Gita Vahini. Bal Vikas children played a central role, delivering thirty speeches and presenting exhibits that conveyed Swami’s teachings with clarity and devotion. In preparation, Gurus Smt. Sai Priya and Smt. Usha Devi visited nearly 60 Bal Vikas families, distributed invitations, and reinforced the discipline of maintaining the Spiritual Diary, thereby strengthening family involvement. The exhibition drew 429 participants, including Bal Vikas families, Gurus, students from other Samithis and non-members, making it a significant outreach initiative.

The event enhanced spiritual literacy among devotees, expanded Bal Vikas engagement through active family participation, and reinforced organizational unity by bringing together multiple districts and Samithis. It served as a model of how seva activities can simultaneously nurture values, strengthen community bonds, and guide individuals toward inner peace.

• Upanyasam on “Sharanagathi” – K K Nagar Samithi

On 13th January 2026, the K.K Nagar Samithi organized an enlightening Upanyasam on “Sharanagathi” at Sri Vidya Old Age Home, delivered by Smt. Lalitha Srinivasan. Drawing inspiration from the Ramayana, she expounded on the six-fold path of Sharanagathi, with particular emphasis on the episode of Vibhishana’s surrender, illustrating the essence of total faith and alignment with divine will. The discourse emphasized humility, self-surrender, and reliance on the Lord’s protection, presented in a simple and compassionate manner that resonated deeply with the elderly audience. Nearly 20 residents attended the session, many of whom were emotionally moved by the comforting and relatable message of Bhagawan.
